DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

February 7, 2026, was defined by sharp partisan divides over the Trump administration's domestic enforcement policies and a major push for a new Democratic economic agenda focused on affordability. Congressional Democrats convened high-profile hearings and press events to condemn what they termed a "campaign of terror" by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) and Customs and Border Protection (CBP), highlighting the recent deaths of U.S. citizens in Minneapolis and Chicago. These events fueled a burgeoning legislative movement to amend **Section 1983** to allow civil lawsuits against federal agents and to end qualified immunity. Simultaneously, Senate Majority Leader Schumer unveiled the "Opportunity Starts at Home" agenda, a comprehensive housing policy designed to counter the administration's focus on tariffs and deregulation, which Democrats argue have inflated construction costs by over \$17,000 per unit ([Source](#), [Source](#)).

On the executive side, President Trump announced **Project Vault**, a \$12 billion public-private strategic critical minerals reserve intended to secure manufacturing supply chains against foreign (primarily Chinese) market disruptions. This coincided with a 54-nation ministerial meeting led by Vice President Vance and Secretary of State Rubio to launch **FORGE**, an international partnership aimed at creating a preferential trade zone with enforceable price floors for essential minerals. In committee rooms, the Senate scrutinized the proposed \$83 billion Netflix-Warner Bros. Discovery merger and debated a national regulatory framework for autonomous vehicles, while Treasury Secretary Bessent and NIH Director Bhattacharya defended the administration's "de-politicization" of federal agencies amidst intense criticism over grant cancellations and the expiration of ACA subsidies ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Immigration Enforcement and Civil Rights Crisis

- Congressional Democrats held an emergency joint hearing featuring testimony from survivors and family members of U.S. citizens killed or injured by ICE and CBP agents, specifically referencing the deaths of Renee Good and Alex Pretti ([Source](#)).
- Minnesota lawmakers were denied entry to an ICE holding facility in Minneapolis, leading to calls to defund the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) unless strict guardrails—including body cameras, mask bans, and an end to roving patrols—are implemented ([Source](#)).

- Legislation was proposed to amend 42 U.S.C. Section 1983 to explicitly include federal officers, effectively removing the barrier that prevents citizens from suing federal agents for constitutional violations ([Source](#)).
- DNI Tulsi Gabbard faced intense criticism for her presence at a domestic FBI raid in Georgia; Senate Intelligence Committee Vice Chair Mark Warner demanded her testimony, citing a violation of the National Security Act's prohibition on domestic intelligence operations ([Source](#)).
- Secretary of State Rubio hosted a ministerial for 54 nations to establish "FORGE," seeking to build a global trade bloc that uses tariffs to maintain "price floors" for minerals, preventing Chinese market flooding ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- The Senate Commerce Committee debated a federal framework for autonomous vehicles (AVs); Tesla and Waymo urged national standards to preempt a patchwork of state laws, while Ranking Member Cantwell cited concerns over NHTSA staffing cuts and safety data ([Source](#)).

Affordability and Economic Policy

- Senate Democrats rolled out a major housing agenda targeting predatory institutional investors, proposing down payment assistance for first-generation buyers, and using the Defense Production Act to scale modular housing ([Source](#)).
- The DOW Jones Industrial Average crossed 50,000 for the first time, an event the administration credited to its "Golden Age" policies, while critics pointed to lingering 3% core inflation and the expiration of ACA subsidies as a "sticker shock" for middle-class families ([Source](#), [Source](#)).
- The NIH began implementing a "Unified Funding Strategy" that centralizes peer review and has led to the termination of over 1,000 grants, which the administration claims removes "woke ideology" but which critics say stalls research into cancer and Alzheimer's ([Source](#)).

Strategic Resource and Tech Oversight

- President Trump announced "Project Vault," using \$10 billion in Export-Import Bank financing to create a strategic stockpile of critical minerals for non-military industrial use ([Source](#)).

- Antitrust scrutiny of the Netflix-Warner Bros. Discovery merger focused on the potential for a "monopsony" in creative labor and the future of the 45-day theatrical release window ([Source](#)).

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Personalization of Federal Authority:

A recurring theme across multiple sectors is the blurring of lines between the President's personal interests and official agency actions. This is evident in the DNI's involvement in a Georgia election probe, the Treasury Secretary being questioned over the President's \$10 billion lawsuit against his own department, and the rebranding of pharmaceutical and investment programs with the "Trump" name (e.g., Trump RX, Trump Accounts). Critics argue this represents an "erosion of democracy" and "crony capitalism," while supporters view it as "full voltage" delivery on a popular mandate ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

The Weaponization of Transparency:

Both the administration and its critics are using transparency as a political tool. The NIH is removing "embargoes" on research to show results faster to taxpayers, and the DOJ is re-

leasing 3 million pages of Epstein files to deflect from other controversies. Conversely, Democrats are using dashcams and "whistle-blower" data to track 470 incidents of federal agent misconduct, creating a "transparency war" where data itself is a battleground ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

Economic "Flooring" as a Defense Mechanism: A new economic trend is the move away from pure free-market floating prices toward "floors" and "reserves." From Project Vault's mineral price floors to Democratic proposals for rent caps and "Connecticut Option" hospital value pricing, there is a bipartisan (though differently applied) move toward government-mandated price stability to counter volatility in the global and domestic markets ([Source](#), [Source](#), [Source](#)).

HYPOTHESES AND FUTURE LEGISLATIVE OUTLOOK

DHS Funding Cliff and the 1983 Amendment: The temporary two-week funding extension for DHS is unlikely to hold unless Republicans concede on body cameras or mask bans. Expect a coordinated Democratic push to tie funding to the "Section 1983" fix, which could garner support from civil-libertarian leaning Republicans like those in the "Gange of Eight" who recently pressured the DNI on whistleblower complaints. National AV Framework Preemption: Liability will be the sticking point for the Surface Transportation Reauthorization. While Chair Cruz wants a "fast lane" for AVs, the Ranking Member's focus on "binding arbitration" clauses in user agreements suggests that any federal standard will have to include significant consumer-right-to-sue provisions to pass the Senate. ([Source](#)).

The "Denmark" Vaccine Model Backlash: The NIH/CDC shift to a reduced vaccine schedule based on the "Danish model" is poised to become a major oversight flash-point. If infection rates for meningitis or hepatitis rise in rural, under-served areas—as predicted by Chair Cassidy—legislative efforts to mandate the ACIP (Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices) process will intensify ([Source](#)).

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The day was heavy on policy rollouts and oversight of existing statutes, particularly the 155-year-old Section 1983 and the newly enacted "One Big, Beautiful Bill" (OB BB). Lawmakers focused on using the upcoming Surface Transportation and DHS funding deadlines as leverage for structural reforms.

This inaugural report is based on deep analysis of CSPAN, CSPAN2 and CSPAN3 coverage in collaboration with the Internet Archive's TV News Archive. It is currently limited to the Congressional business covered on those three CSPAN channels and thus may not include all major Congressional business, may include activity from previous days that aired on a later date, and/or may include other major federal, state and local governmental business. We will continue to refine this report to incorporate a growing array of Congressional information sources.
